CST REFERENCE NUMBER

There used to be a card to fill out containing this information; it would be nice if we could get some more. Some of these things need to be brought up every year. It just seems as though we forget this stuff otherwise.

The paragraph below explains what CST (California Seller of Travel) means. You will see the number referenced on every flyer. Please read this paragraph thoroughly. It is a required for all club trips to make this statement available to you..

California law requires certain sellers of travel to have a trust account or bond. This business has a trust account. All payments for transportation or travel service not provided to the passenger shall be promptly refunded, in accordance with the agreed-to-terms and conditions, unless the passenger otherwise instructs the seller of travel in writing. This business is a participant in the Travel Consumer Restitution Corporations (TCRC). You, the passenger, may request reimbursement from TCRC if you are owed a refund of more than \$50 for transportation or travel services which was not refunded in a timely manner by a seller of travel who was registered and participating in the TCRC at the time of sale. The maximum amount which may be paid by the TCRC to any

one passenger is the total amount paid on behalf of the passenger to the seller of travel, not to exceed \$15,000. A claim must be submitted to the TCRC within six months after the scheduled completion date of the travel. A claim must include sufficient information and documentation to prove your claim and \$35 processing fee. You must agree to waive your right to other civil remedies against a registered participating seller of travel for matters arising out of a sale for which you file a claim with the TCRC, if your were located in California at the time of the sale. You may request a claim form by writing to: Travel Consumer Restitution Corporation, P.O. Box 6001, Larkspur, CA 94977-6001; or by faxing a request to: (415) 927-7698.

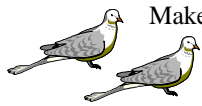

On one of our recent ski trips Dale Shannon observed a member wearing unique devices over the after ski boot that will virtually assure non-skid walking over icy sidewalks, slick parking lots and places, as the first step off the bus on to the icy-snowy street.



These, YAKTRAX, as they are called are stretchy, rubbery traction devices with metal coils that fit over the bottom of ones shoe or boot and are used when conditions suggest (Chains Required.) (Dale noted the Yaktrax, he saw, were worn by Shannon Miller.)

You will, however, need to slip them off on cleared roads and indoor floors.

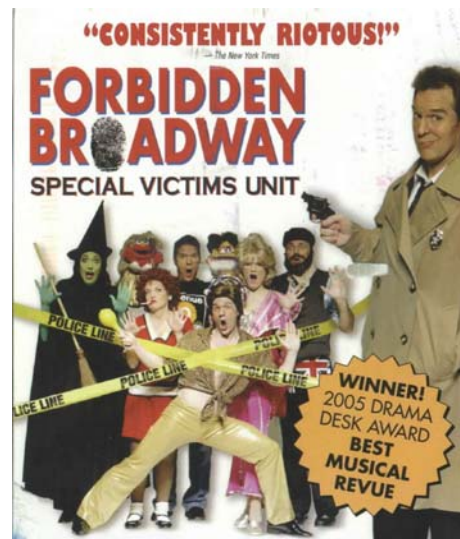

Airline Ski Bag and Boot Bag Weight and Content Limits

Placing clothing in your ski bag could increase the cost of your next ski trip by \$160.

I received an irate email from an old friend and ski club member from Houston in January. She and her husband had just returned from a Texas Ski Council trip and, upon checking in for the return flight, she was hit with an \$80 excess baggage surcharge by Continental Airlines because she had packed a ski suit around her skis to protect them from damage.

After several emails and phone calls between my friend, myself, and Continental Airlines and, after checking the luggage limit sections of United, Continental, American, and Delta Airlines' websites, it became apparent that placing ski clothing inside your ski bag or boot bag can indeed trigger an excess baggage fee with some airlines on both your outbound and in-

bound flights. That could cost you an additional \$160 for your next ski trip!

All of the airlines' policies that we checked stated that, in lieu of one of the two "free" checked bags (which must weigh no more than 50 pounds each), you may check a ski bag containing one pair of skis and one pair of ski poles plus one boot bag containing a single pair of boots.

While only American Airlines in-

cluded the word "only" before the word one in their statement, Continental Airlines told us that any other object placed in the bag could trigger an excess baggage surcharge. United Airlines does not prohibit clothing in ski bags -- with a representative saying, "it's not any of our business what's in ski bags if they weigh less than 50 pounds." All the airlines stated that the combined weight of the boot bag and ski bag must be no more than 50 pounds.


In addition to checked luggage, you may also have one carry-on bag (less than 40 pounds in most cases) and a smaller ~free" item, such as a purse or computer case.

These rules are for domestic travel and will vary when traveling out of the country. Many (but not all) carriers will allow two bags at 70 pounds each when traveling overseas. So, check your carrier's website and carry a copy of the written policy with you on your trip in the event that the gate agent does not understand their company policy.

Armed with the knowledge of what the airline you are using

will and will not allow, weigh your bags before leaving home and make sure you are within both their baggage weight and their baggage content limits. Maybe you really won't need that extra sweater or coat after all
