the last day and left a dusting of the first seasonal snow on the mountain tops which left us with a beautiful day.

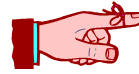

CST REFERENCE NUMBER

The paragraph below explains what CST (California Seller of Travel) means. You will see the number referenced on every flyer. Please read this paragraph thoroughly. It is a required for all club trips to make this statement available to you.

CST 2056054-40

California law requires certain sellers of travel to have a trust account or bond. This business has a trust account. All payments for transportation or travel service not provided to the passenger shall be promptly refunded, in accordance with the agreed-to-terms and conditions, unless the passenger otherwise instructs the seller of travel in writing. This business is a participant in the Travel Consumer Restitution Corporations (TCRC). You, the passenger, may request reimbursement from TCRC if you are owed a refund of more than \$50 for transportation or travel services which was not refunded in a timely manner by a seller of travel who is registered and participating in the TCRC at the time of sale. The maximum amount which may be paid by the TCRC to any one passenger is the total amount paid on behalf of the passenger to the seller of travel, not to exceed \$15,000. A claim must be submitted to the TCRC within six months after the scheduled completion date of the travel. A claim must include sufficient information and documentation to prove your claim and \$35 processing fee. You must agree to waive your right to other civil remedies against a registered participating seller of travel for matters arising out of a sale for which you file a claim with the TCRC, if you were located in California at the time of the sale. You may request a claim form by writing to: Travel Consumer Restitution Corporation, P.O. Box 6001, Larkspur, CA 94977-6001; or by faxing a request to: (415) 927-7698.

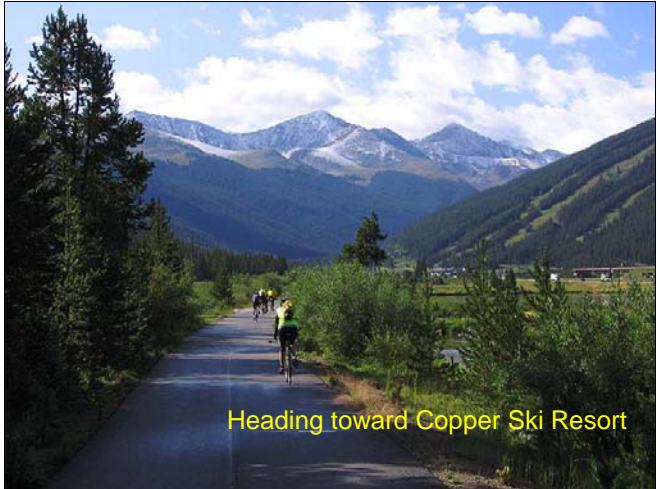

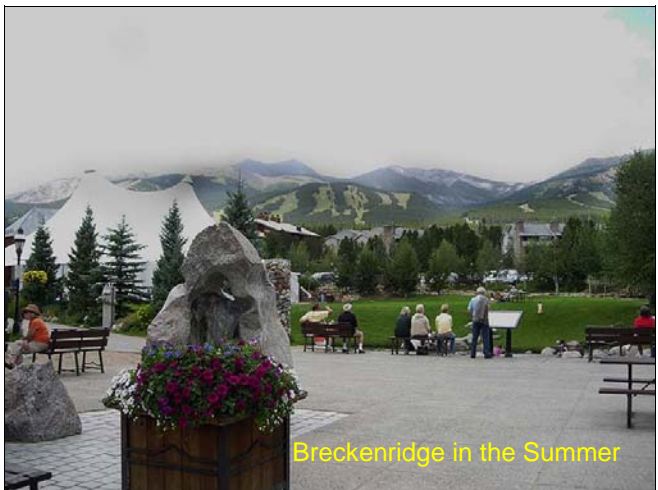

Anyone who ever skied with Jack knew that the clock stood still until he was ready to his satisfaction deciding that it is now time to go, but not before, and it showed. His traveling wardrobe would put a fashion designer to shame whether it was on the hill skiing or for his well know apre-ski

Golf Report for OCTOBER

Visualize your shot

Try this technique for your pre-shot routine. After reading the green, take a long look at the target. Then visualize the shot: its trajectory, where the ball is going to land, how many times it will bounce and how far it's going to roll. Take a few practice swings, always look at the target to get a feel for the distance, step up to the ball, take one last look at the target and hit. By engaging the target, you send a picture to your brain that will cue your swing.

PRACTICE SAFE SKIING

SUNSCREEN (another look) :

Don't be fooled by cold and cloudy days -you can still get burnt. All exposed areas of the skin should be covered in waterproof, broad-spectrum, Sun Protection Factor (SPF) 50+ sunscreen. Apply sunscreen about 20 minutes before venturing outside to allow absorption time.



"Ultraviolet (UVR) (UVB) rays cause the burn; (UVA) are the rays that cause skin cancer. In a recent article published in Archives of Dermatology, University of Montreal, states: When shopping for sunscreen, look for the products that contain the ingredient avobenzone (Parsol 1789). This substance protects against long-wave ultraviolet (UVA) to guard against the possibility of cancer. Brands include PreSun Ultra and Ombrelle.

The SPF sunscreen number tells you how long you can stay in the sun before you may need to reapply.
